Kremstal <sub>DAC</sub> Grüner Veltliner 2022

#### **Origin & Vinification**

This grapes for this wine are sourced from various vineyards surrounding our beautiful city. Here, a mix of Danube gravel, loess and crystalline rocks form the basis of this Grüner Veltliner.

Climatically the cooler Waldviertel region contributes to the freshness of this wine and warm Pannonian air masses from the east give the wine a charming and balanced fruit.

In October 2022, the grapes for this Grüner Veltliner were harvested by hand. Under controlled temperature the must fermented in stainless steel tanks until it stopped naturally. Bottled in January 2023.

#### Wine description

Light green-yellow, silver reflections. Delicately tobacco, a hint of fresh yellow apple, some honeydew melon, nuances of orange zest. Firm, dense, white pome fruit, lively acidity, lemony, animating food accompaniment with a fruity-sweet finish.

## Food pairing recommendation

Grüner Veltliner is a perfect match for Austrian dishes like Tafelspitz, Schnitzel but also steamed fish starters. Aditionally, we recommend this wine to any kinds of fried pork, veal and slightly spiced dishes from various Asian cultures. Vegetarians should try this with steamed vegetables.
